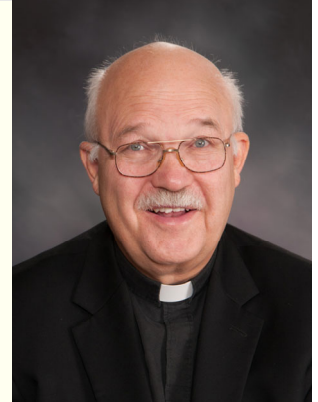

1) Whatever happened to Plans for installing cabinets on the south end of the social hall?

The cabinets are virtually finished and Ed Grace is in the process of installing them. Actually, they may be completed by the time this is in the bulletin. These cabinets will be very helpful for storage of materials used by the Altar Society and other parish groups. They are being paid for by funds from the Altar Society.

2) The electronic sign along 42nd Street?

The sign is in the process of being constructed. We will be building the brick and mortar base very soon and we hope to have the project complete by the end of October. Funds for this project were raised by last year's Keeping the Faith parish and school fundraiser as well by the Men's Club and their big ball tournament for the past two years.

3) The upper parking lot?

This lot is used for parking for Sunday Mass, games at the ball field and other parish functions. It is also used as a playground for our grade school children. It is in bad disrepair and is actually dangerous for the children, given the many holes and breakups of the surface. I have been working with a subcommittee of the parish buildings and grounds committee and other interested parties in planning for this project. We plan to reconstruct the entire parking lot and hope to complete this large project in the first half of 2019. We have a generous commitment from a parish family to cover a large portion of the final cost.

NCDVD FAQ: Do you have to pray a lot as a priest?

You'd better or your well will run dry! You cannot be a faithful priest, useful to the Lord, if you try to go it alone. You need the help and support of brother priests and other people but most of all you need God's grace. You dispose yourself to receive His help by turning to Him frequently in prayer. The priests who are truly happy and effective among God's people are the priests who are faithful to prayer.

Surprisingly, a diocesan priest must often fight for the time for personal prayer. He is often called upon to lead others in public prayer, especially the Mass and the other sacraments of the Church. These are genuine times of prayer for him as well as them — but like every Christian, the priest needs some time each day to spend alone with the Lord. His busy ministry sometimes makes this very difficult but it is something he must strive to keep fresh in his life, lest he lose sight of the One who called him to be a priest in the first place and the One who alone can sustain him.
