

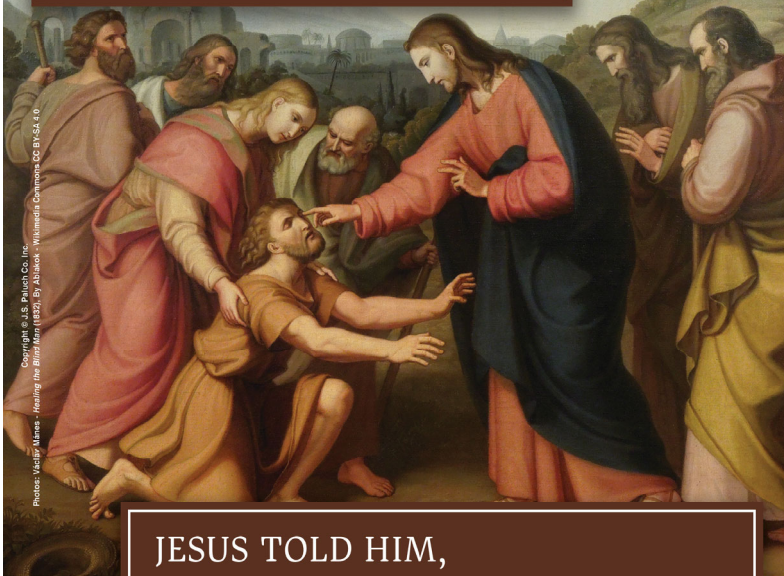

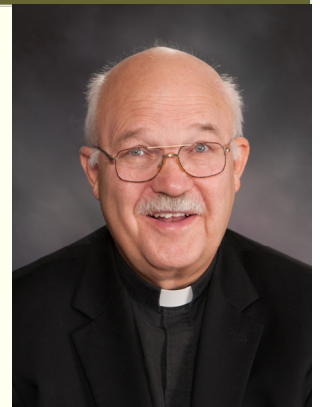

- 1) **Town Hall Meeting** – I would like to invite all of you to attend a parish town hall meeting on Thursday, November 8, 2018. The meeting will be in the social hall from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. At that time, we will present the survey results to the entire parish and invite your input on plans to increase our parishioners' engagement, moving the parish forward in our effort to become the best possible parish we can be. I urge all of you to attend. Your attendance is important to me and to the future of St. Bernadette Parish. In the meantime, please keep this intention in your prayers.

- 2) **All Saints Day** - This week, Thursday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints. On this day, we honor all of those who now share in the joys of the kingdom of heaven. They have lived their lives in faithfulness to God and now share in the salvation won for us by Jesus through his suffering, death and resurrection and the reward of their goodness. This is a day to honor not only those publicly canonized by the church, but all who have received this gift of salvation and now live in heaven. Due to the Halloween festivities, we will not have the regular Holy Day vigil Mass, but rather, we will have three Masses on Thursday, November 1: 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon and 6:00 p.m.

- 3) **All Souls Day** - This week, Friday, November 2 is the Feast of All Souls. On this day, we continue the ancient tradition of praying for the dead. This day affirms our belief in purgatory, which is a time of waiting and purification before souls are able to enter the kingdom of heaven and share fully in the joys of being in God's presence. If we did not believe in this time of purification, there would be no reason to pray for the dead, for if they are in heaven, there would be no need of prayers and if they are in hell, no prayers would do them any good. Please continue to pray for your beloved dead and come join us for this prayer on Friday, November 2 at 8:00 a.m.

- 4) **Memorial Mass** – Here at St. Bernadette, we have a tradition of celebrating a Memorial Mass for those who have died and have been buried from our church during the past year. We are celebrating that Mass today and we are remembering and holding in prayer twenty-nine deceased members. During this Mass, we will be distributing the memorial crosses which have hung on the church wall for the past year to family members as a permanent memorial from St. Bernadette Parish. Please join me in praying for those from our parish who have died over the past year and for their families.

- 5) **Archbishop's Annual Appeal** – Pope Francis' call to the New Evangelization is echoed in the first reading today. "Proclaim your praise and say the LORD has delivered his people." Our gifts to the 2018-19 Archbishop's Annual Appeal bear witness to God's love and mercy at work in our lives. Thank you to all those in our parish who have responded so generously to Archbishop Lucas' invitation to assist him in the work of equipping disciples. To date, our parish has raised \$41,135.00 exceeding our goal of \$40,562.00 with 20.1% participating to date. Please prayerfully consider supporting this year's Archbishop's Annual Appeal.

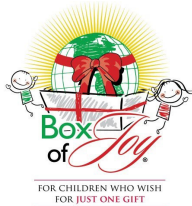

NCDVD FAQ: Do priests get any time off?

The Lord took his apostles apart for some rest after they had worked very hard preaching and healing (Mark 6: 31-32). Diocesan priests work hard, too, and the Lord takes them apart from time to time to rest. In the Archdiocese of Omaha, priests get one day off each week and have up to a month off each year for vacation. It is also wise for them to have hobbies and special interests to turn to for relaxation in the course of a normal day of priestly work, just as they should make time for prayer.

Just as importantly, diocesan priests are asked to make an annual retreat alone or with fellow priests to experience, in the calm and quiet of the retreat atmosphere, the loving touch of their Lord.
