

Veiling of Statues and Icons During Passiontide: The last two weeks in the season of Lent are called Passiontide which begins on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. This is when the Church shifts her focus from Christ in the desert (the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent) to Christ during His Passion. During this period of Passiontide, you may have noticed at St Bernadette and other parishes that the crucifix and other statues and images around the church have been veiled with a purple cloth. The practice of veiling crucifixes and statues during Lent is a rich tradition steeped in liturgical and theological significance. It serves to remind us of the penitential nature of Lent, focus our senses and thoughts on Christ's Passion, and deepen our understanding of the "hidden" aspects of God's presence in our lives. Furthermore, the veils are hard to miss and serve as a reminder for us to get ready. They build within us a longing for Easter Sunday, when Christ lifts all veils through His Resurrection.



Vocations

Have you ever heard of the Melchizedek Project? The Melchizedek Project is an initiative to form six-week discernment groups at colleges, high schools, and parishes for boys or young men considering the priesthood. The goal is to provide information and support for young men as they discern a vocation to the Catholic priesthood before they enter seminary. Most young Catholic men lack the in-depth information they need to prayerfully discern their vocations. Small discernment groups provide a good support structure for men as they "dive deep" into the discernment process. The Melchizedek Project began in 2012 and has spread to more than 140 dioceses, including the Omaha Archdiocese, around the world. It is funded by the Foundation for Priestly Vocations and managed by Vianney Vocations. 
