He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

- Mk 4:39-40

Greetings St. Bernadette / Holy Ghost,

As I prayed with today's gospel, I was struck with Jesus' words, "Let us cross to the other side."

Certainly, the Lord is speaking practically to his disciples about the need to cross the Sea of Galilee, but the Lords words always contain a holy depth that have a multifaceted application for our lives.

The Church has always been compared to a boat; 'the Barque of St. Peter'. Our neighbor to the north, St. Thomas Moore parish, captures this truth through their church architecture, as the inside of their church building resembles a boat. This reality is of course prefigured in Noah's ark, which serves as the only means of salvation amidst the Lord's Justice in the form of a flood. The Church (the boat), built by Jesus (Noah), is protecting humanity from sin (the flood) and the wrath of God (the storm), as She makes her way through the rough and dangerous waters of the world to reach heavenly shores.

Often, we can feel that the God is silent or absent in His Church. Either discontent with the requirement of faith to see beyond the mysteries that veil Him within the priesthood and sacraments or by a seeming lack of response in answer to our prayers, we like the apostles can cry out, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?!" I myself make this cry as the I see the waves of the world breaking over the Barque of Peter, as the water of sin pours in.

What is most comforting in these moments of urgent distress, is the disposition of Jesus amidst the violent storm; This should shock us even more so than the scandal of potentially sinking. Despite all the storm's commotion: the wind, the thunder, the lightening, the waves and soaking rain, Jesus is "in the stern, asleep on a cushion." His disposition is one of peace, security and trust in the Father.


Today's gospel is a great reminder that God is in control, especially when it seems like things are out of control. A violent storm does not bother Jesus at all because He is anchored in His identity of Only Begotten Son of the Father. He knows who God is and He knows who He is in the Father. This allows Him to be peacefully sleeping even in the most unpeaceful circumstances; All He must do is simply "rebuke the wind, and say to the sea, 'Ouiet! Be still!"

Although there will be storms in our lives and even within the Church and He invites us into a radical trust and faith in Him and Our Father. He asks us today, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Do we not yet have faith in Him who is in complete control? Do we not trust that God loves us and will provide for us?

Let us ask for the grace of increased faith and trust in the Lord. Let us join Him in the stern of the boat resting in the peace of His Father. Let us entrust our worries and storms to Him as we make our journey in the boat, over the waters of sin and death to heaven. Let us take courage that He has said to us, "Let us cross to the other side."


