This weekend we read from the 12th chapter of St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. He tells us that there are different kinds of gifts but the same spirit. First, we must recognize what gifts we have been given, and then determine how we are being called to use them to build up the Kingdom of God. The Sound of Silence

In one of my favorite songs, *Car Radio* by Twenty-One Pilots, the singer talks about how his stolen car radio has forced him to sit in silence. This silence makes him deal with reality. He is no longer able to distract himself with music, the news, audiobooks, or the like. He can't hide from his thoughts and emotions. Silence spurs us to think deeper. Yet, its hard to get into that silence. With smartphones always within reach, streaming networks giving us more shows to watch, music playing everywhere, we can't escape this noisy world. The noise blocks out the whisper of God (1 Kings 19:11-13). We need to sit in the silence to hear the Father more clearly. A simple way to become familiar with silence, similar to the song mentioned above, is to drive to work (or back home) in silence. It might be uncomfortable, but it will be good. It will have you come face to face with what is bothering you instead of numbing it. It will lead to beautiful prayer, talking with the Father about what is really going on. It will bring about a heart-to-heart conversation with your Father.

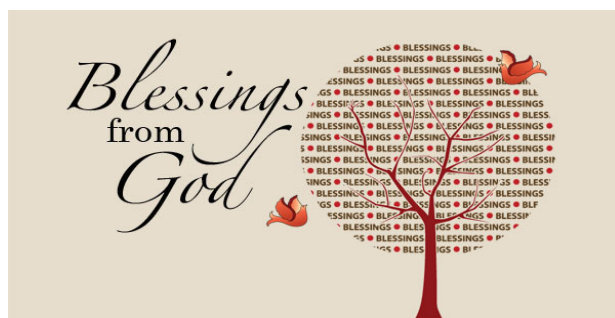
