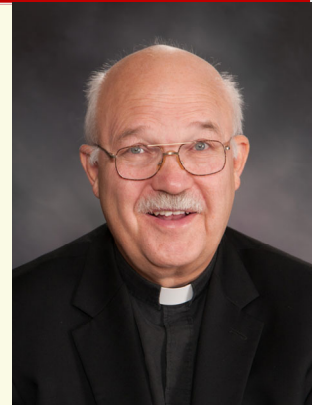

Today we enter Holy Week. Over the next seven days, we will follow Jesus on the most holy journey of His life on this earth. We walk with Him on His triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. We sit with Him as He gives us the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday at the Last Supper in the intimate setting of the upper room. We follow Him at His trial and condemnation overnight. We accompany Him on the way to Calvary for His crucifixion on Good Friday. We wait with the entire world as He lies in the tomb. Finally, with the apostles and other disciples, we witness the risen Jesus on Easter morning. What a story! What a journey! I invite all of you to take this journey with your fellow parishioners this week.

On Monday, I will join Archbishop Lucas, my brother priests and Catholics from throughout the Archdiocese for the Chrism Mass at St. Cecilia Cathedral. At this time, we priests will renew our priestly vows, first made on our ordination day. The Mass also includes the ceremony for the Archbishop to consecrate the Oil of Chrism used in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination of priests, as well as in consecrating new churches. He will also bless the oil of Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick used for sacramental celebrations throughout the archdiocese in the coming year. Please pray for priests on this occasion when we commemorate the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Orders by Jesus at the Last Supper. Also pray for all of those who will receive sacraments using the oils blessed on this day, including those to be baptized and confirmed at St. Bernadette this year.
