If you are a father, take your role seriously. Recently, a well-known coach in Nebraska resigned his position in order to be able to spend more time with his family, not wanting his children to grow up with an absentee father. People admire and respect that decision, yet fail to do the same in their own lives. It is always a challenge for men to balance the demands of their job and career with the demands of being involved in the lives of their children. Many dedicated and sincere men end up giving so much time and energy to their careers, for the benefit of their families. Yet they end up neglecting those very ones for whom they are doing these things.

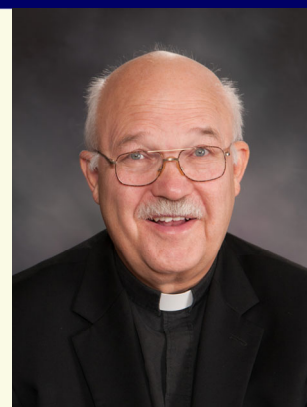
If you are a father, be aware of your importance in passing the faith on to your children. All too often, the task of passing on the faith is given over to the mother. While she might perform this role admirably, she cannot replace the important role of a father. As a matter of fact, the greatest indicator of whether children will continue to practice their faith as they grow into adulthood is the faith practice of their fathers as they are growing up. Your role is indispensable. Don't give your Sunday mornings over to golf, baseball, fishing or other activities and neglect the important place of Sunday Mass. Don't let mothers be the only parent to promote prayer and spirituality in your homes. Embrace your important role in this area.

For all of us, be sure to honor your father on this day. Whether your father is living or has died, be sure to pray for him. Pray for God to bless him to be a good father. Pray for his good health. Pray that he will have the zeal and courage to fulfill his role. Pray for him to be forgiven for his sins and failings. And if he has died, continue to pray that he be received into the arms of a merciful God in heaven.

Be aware of scams out there

Recently, we have learned of several attempted scams affecting our parishes and parishioners. One of them contacts people by phone and tells them that their pastor is in need of money and they are asked to give their credit card number or gift cards to help their pastor, whose name they give. A pastor would never act in this way, but sincere people who love their pastors can be drawn into such of a scam. Another also contacts people by phone and tells them that their power or water will be shut off if they do not provide a payment of several hundred dollars. Utility companies do not operate in this manner. They send notices by mail and do not call their customers to request payment.

Be aware of the presence of unscrupulous people who are very clever in creating scams. If you are uncertain about such requests, you can call the police or the utility directly.
