What is love? Thinkers from Plato and Aristotle to one-hit wonder singer Haddaway have asked this question, trying to define it. The ancient Greeks categorized love into four categories: familial, friendship, romantic, and unconditional. Yet, St. Augustine would say there is only one type of love, and it comes from God. All love will share in the characteristics of God's love within the Trinity and for us.

So, what does this love look like? Pope Benedict XVI, in *Deus Caritas Est*, talks about the transformation that love undergoes. In our search for love, it moves beyond the focus of the self to the other. It no longer emphasizes the self but focuses only on the other. It stops us from navel gazing and turns us outward where we forget about ourselves. We are willing to sacrifice for them. A priest once told me that sacrifice is just another word for love. Are you willing to sacrifice your time, goals, dreams, wealth, and more for the other? Think of the greatest example of love: Christ on the Cross. St Augustine called Christ's death the marriage-bed of the cross. There is pain in that love being united to His bride, the Church, forever, yet He only thinks of her. He is not holding back anything for Himself.

So, how can we grow into this love? A common wedding reading is St. Paul's Ode to Love (1 Corinthians 13:4-8). I often thought of these verses as a nice little poem about love. But St Paul is calling us to the concreteness of true love. Substitute your name for the word "love". Where was I patient? Where was I kind? Do I keep a record of this person's wrongdoing? Am I persevering in the relationship? Allow your love to be refined like gold. As humans, we will rarely, if ever, have perfect love. Yet, with a God who is love, we share in His love. Lose yourself in the love of the Beloved.

**More than 150 Relics Coming to Nebraska**  
Spirit Catholic Radio Network presents Treasures of the Church—a relics exposition and healing ministry—at Scottsbluff, Sidney, Hastings, Grand Island, Lincoln, Omaha, Nebraska City Hartington from June 17<sup>th</sup> June 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022. More than 150 sacred relics will be on display—some believed to be as old as 2,000 years. Among the treasures are relics of Pope St. John Paul II, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Padre Pio and St. Faustina. In addition, there will be one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world, as well as, a piece of a veil believed to have belonged to Our Lady. Presented by Fr. Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross. Attendees are encouraged to bring their articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which may be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercessory prayer. The ministry has had reports of healing among a number of visitors to the exposition. 
