– The Archbishop’s Six-Year Goal: continued

Thresholds of Conversion

Over the past weeks we have talked about the first six thresholds; Trust, Openness, Seeking, Decision, Beginning Disciple and Missionary Disciple.

Today we explore the 7th and final threshold, ‘Fruitful Disciple’, where a person is fully equipped for lifelong Catholic mission and makes any sacrifice to help another person to grow spiritually.

Throughout the past weeks we have looked at a person’s journey from being invited to learn more about God to sharing the good news of Jesus with their fellow man. Today we explore the final step, where this person, now fully equipped to share the good news, is fully committed to the spiritual growth of their fellow man. This may include making substantial sacrifices of their own time or commitments, to put the wellbeing of others above themselves.

These seven thresholds or steps are laid out as a clear path to missional and fruitful discipleship. In this way, we are able to fully participate in moving our parish forward to becoming a missional church. Archbishop Lucas understands that this is a process that will take years, not weeks or months. That is why he has set a goal for each parish in the archdiocese to become a missional church in the next six years. Are you willing to step up to help St. Bernadette reach that goal?

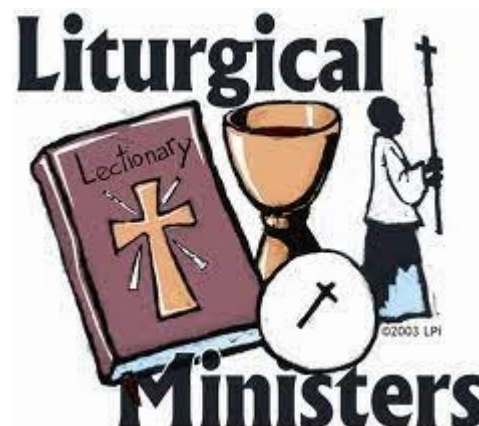
