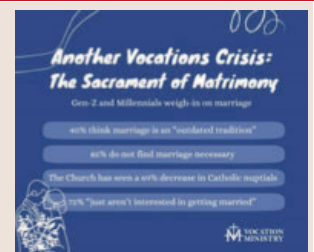
Did You Know

enter the sacrament of Matrimony."

- ◆ 40% of Gen-Z and Millennials think that marriage is an outdated tradition
- ◆ 85% of them do not find marriage necessary to have a fulfilled and committed relationship
- ◆ The Church has seen a 69% decrease in Catholic nuptials
- ◆ 72% "just aren't interested in getting married"
